- Basic education offers self-paced learning in writing, reading and math and earning elective high school credit.
- Internships and jobs are available in public service offices, parks, libraries, hospitals, daycare centers and other real-world workplaces.
- Employability skills training helps prepare you for your job this summer and in the future.



General Program Information

Work hours vary from 20 to 40 hours per week. The duration of the Summer Program varies from 4 to 7 weeks, depending on the specific work or education program. Wages paid will be the minimum wage of \$10.50 an hour.

Who can apply?

Youth age 14 to 21 by June 1, 2018. You must be a permanent resident in Pima County! Please be aware that due to policies and requirements set forth by particular departments and worksites not all ages may be eligible for every summer program included within this application process.

Special Recruitment

Transportation and Regional Wastewater Reclamation Departments - Outdoor Jobs

These jobs consist of outside manual labor. By checking this box on the application, your name will be entered into a special pool for outside jobs only and may increase the likelihood of your being selected for a summer job.

These special recruitment jobs provide unique experiences in transportation. Participants receive protective clothing, sunscreen, water and training in safety procedures.

Don't put off applying for the 2018 Summer Youth Programs. Complete the application carefully.

Assessments for out-of-school youth will not be scheduled after March 23. In-school youth must submit a copy of the most-recent report card/transcript by March 23 by fax (520-770-4134) or email (youthcenter@pima.gov.)
